In the beginning, health services on the island began with a doctor and a nurse making weekly visits to Dunwich on North Stradbroke Island.





Our YBB team is growing!



Brenst Cancer Awareness &

If you are aged 50-74, get your free breast screen done every two years. BreastScreen Australia offers free breast screening for women without symptoms aged 50-74, when screening has the greatest potential to prevent deaths from breast cancer.

Women aged 40-49 and 75 years and older who have no breast cancer symptoms or signs are also eligible for free screening mammograms.


Even if you have a mammogram every 2 years, you should become familiar with the shape, feel and look of your breasts.

What to look for:



- A new lump or lumpiness, especially in just 1 breast
- Changes in breast size, shape or colour
- Changes in the nipples, like redness, discharge or inversion (turned inside out)
- Skin changes, such as dimpling, swelling and bulging
- Irritation or rashes
- Pain that doesn't go away.




YBB COMMUNITY CHRISTMAS PARTY


